In 1773 some colonists in Boston, Massachusetts demonstrated their frustration by dressing up like Indians, sneaking onto ships in the harbor, and dumping imported tea into the water This was called the Boston Tea Party The British took action by closing the Boston port A similar but smaller tea party took place in Yorktown, Virginia in 1774
